Epiphany House Blessing with Chalk for 2024

Mass for Epiphany

Vigil Mass at 7.00pm in St Brigid’s (Also First Friday Mass) Epiphany is a Holy Day of Obligation. Peters Pence collection will be taken up at this Mass.

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING

There is a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany (6 January) when the family gather to ask God’s blessing on their home and family life. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes.

Instructions for Blessing the Home

Using the blessed chalk (Bring Chalk to Mass on 5th January in St Brigid’s and it will be blessed) mark the lintel of your front door as follows:

20 + C + M + B + 24 saying: The three Wise Men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God’s Son who became human two thousand and twenty-three years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Then say the following prayer:

Visit, O Blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and for ever. Amen.

This new year, perhaps more than ever, is a year in which we need to invite Jesus into our homes, our Domestic Churches.



St Laurence O’Toole’s Church Belleeeks

Works have begun on the roof of the Church with two thirds of the roof now been stripped and replacement laths and felt put in place.

The building has been power washed in preparation for a further assessment in the new year in relation to penetrating damp.

St Malachy’s Church Ballymoyer

The Window restoration project has begun, this is a phased project, which means windows will only be replaced when finances become available. Other works which we would hope to complete on the Church include repainting of the building and an upgrade of the radiators.
