

The Epiphany chalking of the door is an ancient Catholic tradition that will take place on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2025, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. The tradition involves chalking a special inscription above the entrance of a home.

The inscription is a request for Christ to bless the home and stay with its inhabitants throughout the year.

The tradition symbolizes an open invitation for the Lord's presence and blessing.


# The Feast of the Epiphany

The Feast of the Epiphany is celebrated on 6<sup>th</sup> January. This feast commemorates the visit of the wise men to worship the baby Jesus. Tradition tells us that their names were Caspar, Melchior and Balthassar. The men were astrologers who were looking for the star that would lead them to the promised Messiah. This was prophesied in the Book of Micah.

According to the Gospel narratives, the wise men brought gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh with them. These gifts were very meaningful. Gold was a precious and expensive gift and showed how important Jesus was. Frankincense is a sweet perfume which was often burned in the temple to worship God. It was a sign that Jesus should be worshipped. Myrrh was used to keep things fresh, and it was used by the women to anoint Jesus' body when he died. By bringing it as a gift to Jesus, the wise men foretold his suffering and death.

The Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord Jesus Christ is one of the oldest Christian feasts, though, throughout the centuries, it has celebrated a variety of things. *Epiphany* comes from a Greek verb meaning "*to reveal,*" and all of the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to humanity.

## **BELLEEKS CHAPEL RESTORATION UPDATE!**

We wish to keep you updated on the works project to restore Belleeks Chapel.

In order to complete the works to the roof where we have encountered significant problems, we will need to raise a further £30,000.00.

A committee has been formed to co-ordinate and organise a fund-raising campaign which should raise the required funding. This campaign will require assistance from all parishioners and in particular the families of loved ones who are interred in the graveyard in Belleek.

The committee has agreed that the best way of successfully achieving our goal is to ask the families of loved ones who are interred in the graveyard to contribute £500.00 towards the completion of the roof. We would also welcome contributions from all

#### **CAN YOU HELP?**

As we continue to maintain and develop our Parish we do need financial support. We are therefore asking you to consider the following:
